Everyone Can Draw: Drawing on the Right Side of the Brain

Learn to use the creative part of your brain:

This workshop will guide you through the beginning steps of learning to see through accessing the creative and intuitive parts of your brain and transferring what you see onto paper. For the purpose of learning to draw we will simplify the human brain into *Left Mode* and *Right Mode* thinking. Education is traditionally based on teaching left mode thinking (verbal, analytic symbolic, rational, logical and linear). Everyone, not only artists, need to develop right mode thinking (non-verbal, intuitive, spatial, non-temporal and holistic) to reach their potential. We will focus on exercises that the dominant left mode thinking cannot do.
